The annual fall workshop for Challenge X students provided not just education this year, but exciting news as well.

The fall workshop is held each year to refresh students on rules of the competition, and to educate them on software and equipment used for the competition. This year, however, the workshop was a podium for announcing that the Challenge X competition has been extended and will go into a fourth year. Few details were released about the fourth year, but it will include further refinement to the vehicle, and intensified outreach activities.

"We were shocked, but excited to hear that there will be a fourth year of competition," said David Oglesby, team leader.

While at the workshop, the team attended sessions on topics that they will use during the third year, including consumer acceptability, emissions modeling, human factors, and media and outreach ses-

sions. The sessions will provide the team with knowledge they need to keep their vehicle competitive this year. The third year's main goal is getting the vehicle to a point where it is very close to showroom quality.

The team also was able to do some outreach, speaking to a class of middle-school students from Ottawa about the Challenge X competition.

Thrust Update Area: What are they working on?

Vehicle Modeling and Controls

The group has been working on testing and analyzing our current configuration. In addition to this, we have been running simulations of our new components and planning for the rest of the year.

Mechanical

The group is preparing for vehicle sound testing, designing a new engine intake air box, and evaluating vehicle interior for consumer acceptability improvements.

Powertrain

The group is working with the competition organizers on possible component changes for year 3. They are also working on refining some existing areas of the vehicle including air flow and cooling.
